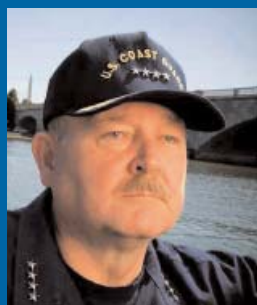

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MAJOR CHANGES ARE AHEAD. WILL YOU BE READY FOR THEM?

Ever since the DP World debacle, Congress has been paying very close attention to port security. Now it has passed the most sweeping maritime and port security legislation since the Maritime Transport & Security Act (MTSA) ushered in the post 9/11 era of maritime security.

The new Security and Accountability For Every Port Act of 2006 (the "SAFE Port" Act) has been widely welcomed because it authorizes \$400 million in annual federal port security grant funding for each of the next five years. But there's much more to the act than that... and if you're involved in any way with maritime and port security, you need to get up to speed on new requirements on a range of issues from TWIC (transport worker identification credentials), to random physical inspection of con-

tainers, citizenship of facility security officers, unannounced inspection of facilities, long range vessel tracking...and more.

MARITIME & PORT SECURITY 2007 will give authoritative insights into all aspects of what's involved in compliance with the SAFE Port Act and other maritime security legislation. It will look at enforcement priorities. It will explore what needs to be done to take advantage of security grants and look at what's involved in the new Green-Lane program.

MARITIME & PORT SECURITY 2007 will also look beyond the U.S. to see what new international requirements are under development.

MARITIME & PORT SECURITY 2007 will feature presentations by industry professionals with practical experience of living in today's maritime and port security environment. They will draw on that experience to point out how to avoid common, easily avoided, compliance lapses that can result in penalties and delays to ships and cargoes.

This is an intensive, two day executive gathering featuring a particularly well-qualified panel of speakers. As at all MARINE LOG conferences, there will be ample opportunities for discussion, Q&A's and networking.
